



## Album Review: The Fall – “Re-Mit”

The Fall  
Re-Mit  
(Cherry Red Records)

Despite coming out of England’s first-wave punk movement in the mid-70’s alongside bands like The Buzzcocks, The Fall has morphed over the successive decades into a sound more akin to art-punk and post-punk, incorporating plenty of synths, and a slew of abrasive noises.

Re-Mit, the band’s latest and 30th studio album, shows they have pretty much divorced themselves from those first few albums (not surprisingly, vocalist Mark E. Smith is the only original member) and are perfectly content living in cult band territory. Those looking to finally discover the oft-name checked band through their latest release would be best advised to go back to any number of earlier albums instead. The dozen songs on Re-Mit are among their least accessible to date. There are some good songs on this one for long-time fans of the band, but you have to wade through a lot of unintelligible vocals and synth-heavy beeps and whirrs, and throbbing bass and drums to get to the meat.

Though it may take time to sink in, the repeated listens ultimately pay off for diehard fans. It’ll likely be a tough sell for all others though. (John B. Moore)
