



Blood Sweat & Tears: Spinning Wheel (E/Cherry Red DVD, 58 min.). The band had split in 1978, but singer David Clayton-Thomas reformed the band in 1980 for one last album, "Nuclear Blues." This April 9, 1980 show in Halifax was the 10th and final U.K. show of the tour. The band lineup is not the classic one, but the sound is similar. The hits are covered "God Bless the Child," "Lucretia MacEvil," "And When I Die," "Spinning Wheel" and "You Made Me So Very Happy" — but most are abbreviated versions. There's an overture and Clayton-Thomas drops in bits of several well-known reggae songs during "You're the One," but far too much time is given to the then-new "Spanish Wine" instrumental, which lacks excitement. **Grade B**
