The band was on the verge of making it big with the the success of their **CCR** cover *Up Around the Bend* but it all came crashing down after the accident. If you're not familiar with the band, they formed back in 1979 in Helsinki and were a mix between punk and 50's rock n roll. They were truly

pioneers in the industry and have influenced many bands, most notably **Guns N Roses**. Well thanks to **MVD Entertainment** you can now catch a glimpse of the band in their prime with the new release of *The Nottingham Tapes*.

The Nottingham Tapes is a show filmed of the band in Nottingham England on April 23rd 1984, when the band was in their prime and preparing to take the world by storm. The DVD captures a magical night in the band's career in which they performed a killer set consisting of 14 tracks. Vocalist **Mike Monroe** owns the stage and for some reason reminds me of a younger **Mick Jagger**. The video quality of the DVD is fair, but you have to realize this was filmed in 84 and probably with a low budget. The sound quality of the DVD is spot on and truly gives you a sense of being at the show. The performance from the band is stellar and will be a must for any Hanoi Rocks fans.
