

15. **Half Japanese *Half Gentlemen/Not Beasts*** (Fire Records)

Maryland experimental punk greats' 1980 debut is given the deluxe edition treatment from Fire Records in the form of this three-disc box set with 32 page booklet and new tracks, limited to 2000 copies. This title will also be released in a 4XLP boxset featuring an extra 12" containing tracks not originally available on the debut and extra unreleased tracks. This deluxe set also includes a 32 page booklet and an original Jad Fair poster 30cm x 60cm and a download card. The CD version also contains a CD of the extra material and the 32 page booklet.

16. **King Crimson *Going Schizoid with King Crimson*** (Discipline Global Mobile)

This exclusive release includes a 10-track CD compilation of live performances (ranging from 1969 all the way to 1998), a band-driven graphic novel based on 'The Vicar Chronicles' (described by the band as "semi-fictional stories about the inner madness of the music industry"), and a collectibles bundle of t-shirt, poster, and stickers all based on the artwork from the band's seminal masterpiece *In the Court of the Crimson King*.

17. **R.E.M. *Live in GREENsboro*** (Rhino)

Limited to 2500 copies and easily the most affordable thing on the RSD shelf at \$7.98, this five-track EP gathers the material left off the live bonus disc featured on Rhino's 25th anniversary deluxe edition of R.E.M.'s 1988 major label debut *Green*.

18. **Bardo Pond - *Rise Above It All*** (Fire Records)
500 copies, features covers of Funkadelic's "Maggot Brain" and "The Creator has a Master Plan" by Pharoah Sanders.

19. **Orange Juice - *LP reissues*** (Domino)

At long last, the four indispensable Polydor-era albums from Scottish post-punk greats Orange Juice—1982's *You Can't Hide Your Love Forever* and *Rip It Up* and 1984's *Texas Fever* and *The Orange Juice*—are made available once again for RSD on vinyl with download cards for each title.

20. **Daniel Johnston - *Fun*** (Org Music)

Mr. Johnston's most accessible LP makes its long-awaited debut on vinyl in honor of its 20th anniversary.

21. **Willie Nelson - *Crazy: The Demo Sessions*** (Sugar Hill)

When Willie first got to Nashville he cut some demos for Ray Price and Hal Smith's publishing company, Pamper Music. Though these cuts were used to pitch songs to artists (including 'Crazy' for Patsy Cline) and producers, many weren't released. These 1960-1966 tracks are available for the first time on vinyl.

22. **Chet Atkins - *Black Jack EP*** (Sundazed)

From the kings of rock up in Coxsackie, NY comes this exclusive 7-inch featuring four previously unreleased recordings from the guitar guru's RCA/Victor days.

23. **Bobby Rush - *Southern King of Blues Funk*** (Soul Selector)

Excellent best-of collection covering the entire span of the blues funk legend's career, created exclusively for Record Store Day.

24. **Phish - *Lawn Boy Deluxe Vinyl Edition*** (JEMP)

Phish's second studio album, pressed on two 180g Audiophile grade Vinyl LPs. Lacquers cut at Bernie Grundman Mastering from the original stereo 1/4" mater reels. Foil stamp numbered first pressing of 7,500 with a really cool etch on Side D and includes a download for free MP3s of the entire album.

25. **Flaming Lips - *Zaireeka*** Vinyl Edition (Warner Bros.)

Thought it was a trick to play all four CDs of the Lips' lofty 1997 sonic experiment simultaneously? Wait until you try doing the same thing on vinyl!

26. **Big Star - *Nothing Can Hurt Me*** (Omnivore)

This special pressing of the soundtrack to Magnolia Pictures' upcoming documentary on the game-changing power pop group is literally teeming with previously unreleased rough cuts, alternative takes and newly spruced up mixes of their greatest songs. No fan of Big Star should overlook this most excellent exclusive.

27. ***Last Shop Standing*** DVD (Blue Hippo Media/MVD)

Dubbed as the official film of Record Store Day 2013, this deluxe edition of the insightful documentary inspired by the book of the same name by Graham Jones charts the rapid rise of record shops in the 1960's / 70s and 80's in the UK as well as its equally quick dwindling in the mid-2000s with commentary from over 20 record shop owners along with input from such English music greats as Paul Weller, Johnny Marr, Norman "Fatboy Slim" Cook and Billy Bragg. This deluxe edition of the DVD includes over 74 minutes of bonus footage.

28. **Elvis Costello and The Roots Collaborative album - *The Roots Things Fall Apart*** (Universal Music Enterprises)

Still a shroud of mystery surrounding this exciting new joint venture born from the bespectacled rock icons three appearances on *Late Night with Jimmy Fallon* with the Philly hip-hop crew as his backing band. But all we know is that its 14 songs deep and hailed as "brilliant" by drummer Questlove in the press. Can't wait! But even if it doesn't come out in time for Saturday, we still have The Roots' critically acclaimed and best-selling album, 1999's *Things Fall Apart*, makes its full-art double LP debut with this audiophile-quality 180-gram vinyl release, presented in a gatefold sleeve with liner notes, to look forward to.
