



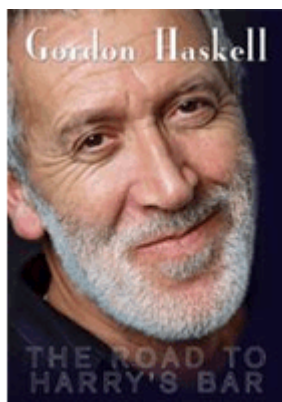

What has Gordon Haskell been up to since way back then? I don't really know. It is said on his resume on MVD, that he has had his "blind moments... surviving by doing it his way". He has put out a very good "Jazz-Pop" solo album in 2002, and the concert featured on this DVD visits many of the tracks from that album.</p>

I would qualify the music on *The Road To Harry's Bar* as sophisticated adult "Jazz-Pop". In my opinion, the most obvious reference would be **Michael Franks**. In fact, checking on the setlist, I noticed that **Haskell** does revisit a few **Michael Franks** songs. Fans of **Sade**, **Boz Scaggs** and others of that stature should really get into **Haskell's** music.
