

St. Wyspianskiego<br/>(Wyspianski Theater).Sure, I have heard of Gordon Haskell before, because of his work with Robert Fripp and King Crimson... but<br/>this was more than thirty years ago. What has Gordon Haskell been up to since way back then? I don't really<br/>know. It is said on his resume on MVD, that he has had his "blind moments... surviving by doing it his way". He<br/>has put out a very good "Jazz-Pop" solo album in 2002, and the concert featured on this DVD visits many of the<br/>tracks from that album.

I would qualify the music on *The Road To Harry's Bar* as sophisticated adult "Jazz-Pop". In my opinion, the most obvious reference would be **Michael Franks**. In fact, checking on the setlist, I noticed that **Haskell** does revisit a few **Michael Franks** songs. Fans of **Sade**, **Boz Scaggs** and others of that stature should really get into **Haskell**'s music.

The Road To Harry's Bar is one of the best recorded, filmed and performed concert I have seen on DVD. I have greatly enjoyed viewing it and will put it very often in player in years to come. My highest recommendation indeed.
