their own unique brand of idiosyncratic music all the while keeping their identities a secret. The band's new DVD Demons Dance Alone may not illuminate who exactly has been behind the many masks and costumes The Residents employ to retain their anonymity, but it does, however, reinforce the fact that The Residents are one of the most imagi-

The Residents are not a typical band, and Demons Dance Alone is not a typical filmed live performance. With footage captured by a camera that was fastened to a black figure that wanciered the stage during the October and Novermber performances of the band's 2002 U.S. tour, Demons Dance Alone provides a welcome glimpse of a group that no matter how close you get, their mystery only seems to deepen. But this intimate look at The Residents onstage is a generous snapshot intimate look at The Residents onstage is a generous snapshot
of their complex and dramatic stage presentation, and consists of fifteen songs, including the reflective "Honey Bear," the dark and grinding "Wolverines," and the oddly affecting "Life Would Be Wonderful." Known for their legendary costumes-giant eyeballs, top hats and tuxedos, and newspaper suits-Demons Dance Alone finds The Residents dressed in what looks to be post-apocalyptic Egyptian garb, with its singer often carrying a lantern. The band may be up to its old tricks of inventive costuming, but what's new is the addition of a female vocalist, also in disguise--whose interplay augments the theatrical nature of the live performance. Featuring bits of interpretative dance, a demon-like masked trumpet player and a dark and whimsical set list, Demons Dance Alone is a strange and satisfying experience.
