The **Beggar's Group** (the label formally known as Beggar's Banquet) has rereleased *Immigrant*, *Promise* and *Discover*, the first three long-out-of-print albums by underrated '80s goth glam pop tarts **Gene Loves Jezebel**. Each album is a deluxe 2-CD set featuring original versions, demos and B-sides (including mucho previously unheard stuff) and unreleased photos in the new sleeve notes, which contain full track details and lyrics as well. Fronted by androgynous Welsh twins **Jay and Michael Aston**, the group was signed by Geffen in America off their third album, *Discover*.

A "best of" collection from the pioneers of the Batcave sound (a techno-tinged goth offshoot that started in London's Batcave club in the early '80s) featuring "R.I.P." (new mix) and "I'm Doing Time in a Maximum Security Twilight Home." Quirky and dark. —T.F.
