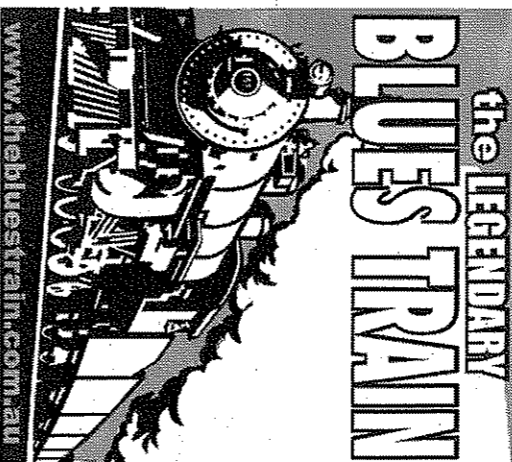

### The Blues Train

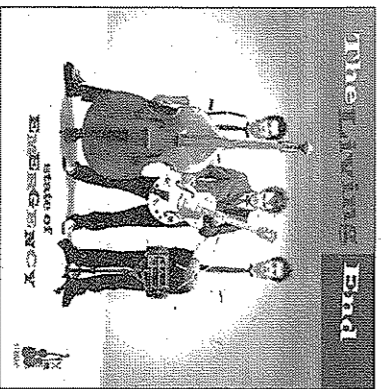
Take one steam train, four carriers, 200 people, dinner and show shake vigorously as you pound down the track an what do you have? The Legendary Blues Train, down on the Bellarine Peninsula on Melbourne's Port Phillip Bay. It's different and it's fun.

The Blues Train experience begins at Queenscliff where patrons of all ages tuck into a hearty meal prepared by Pasquini's Deli. Drinks to take on the journey are available on the platform from a bar in the guard's van, open at each of the four stops. At each stop revellers swap carriages to find a new band tuning-up ready for the next act. One of the carriages only has seating running along each wall. The seating arrangement and up-beat music in this carriage leaves little option other than getting up for a bit of a boogie.

It is only an hour and a half drive down to Queenscliff so why not stay for the weekend and enjoy many of the great weekenders and hotels on site?

Book now as seats are always limited and The Steam Train experience closes in May for winter.
