Thunders teams up with ex-Dolls, Arthur 'Killer' Kane and Jerry Nolan for a historical, one off gig at The Roxy, L.A., on January 4, 1987. The trio of Thunders, Kane & Nolan have all since passed away which makes this recording extremely special as it captures their last appearance together (a dozen years on since their previous bond).

Thunders is a showman, and his Dick Turpin attire confirms his position as a rock 'n' roll rebel.
