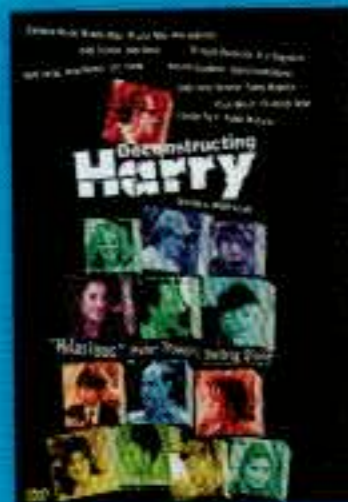


NETFLIX PICK OF THE MONTH

the devil, and a lot of angry women on his journey to enlightenment. Check out the R-rated classic—my current favorite film.

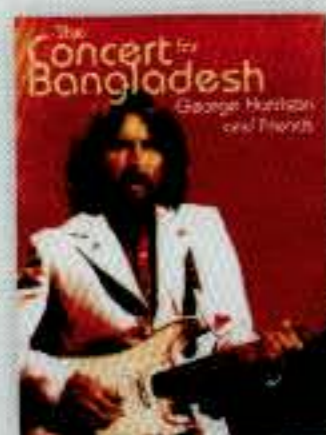

Filmed on August 1, 1971 in Madison Square Garden, this concert was organized by George Harrison and **Ravi Shankar** to raise money to help refugees dying of starvation in Bangladesh. The band is composed of nearly every major music hero from the day, including **Eric Clapton**, **Bob Dylan**, **Billy Preston**, **Leon Russell**, **Ringo Starr**, and many more. The set list is also ridiculously good: "My Sweet Lord," "It Don't Come Easy," "While My Guitar Gently Weeps," "Here Comes The Sun," and a bunch of other classic tracks. Do yourself a favor and go buy this two-disc set. If you do, a portion will be donated to UNICEF—George's way of helping even though he left this world in 2001.

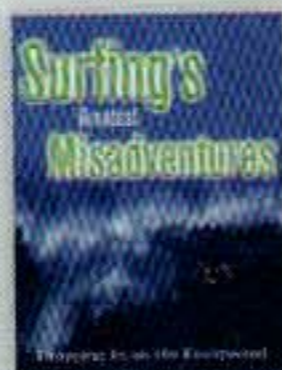

from Leroy Grannis' personal collection, this beautifully bound 290-page book chronicles the beginning of surfing's heyday in the early 60s and goes all the way through the late 70s. His photos show a time in surfing's life when the whole culture of the surfing lifestyle was being created. Gidget cruised Malibu, Woodies were the ultimate surf wagons, guys rode redwood boards, and people smiled in the lineup—those must have been the days. The book isn't cheap (around \$400), but it's heirloom quality and limited to only 1,000 signed copies.
