The new **Cannibal Corpse** CD *Kill* is now out in stores. Longtime guitarist Jack Owen left the band after 2004's *The Wretched Spawn* came out. Original guitarist Jeremy Turner filled in for the band during their remaining tours. Then, Rob Barrett, who played on Cannibal's infamous albums *The Bleeding* and *Vile*, rejoined the band as a full-time member. *Kill* was produced by Erik Rutan (member of Hate Eternal/formerly of Morbid Angel) at Mana Studios in St. Pete's, Florida.

In hair-metal news, **Poison** have released a DVD titled *Seven Days Live* which captures the band at the height of their success, with a full live show recorded in London in 1993.
