# THE FILM

GG Allin wasn't simply a hardcore performer, he was a cult legend of the <u>music</u> genre, riding his potent brand of lunacy into the dark recesses of performance and media frenzy. Allin was a unique punk personality, a frightening human being when provoked, and, to some, a feces-smeared deity.

"Hated" is a pistol-whipped documentary about GG and his band The Murder Junkies as they tried to assemble a tour of America in the early 1990s.



Starting life as a 10-minute NYU student project from director Todd Phillips ("Old School"), "Hated" grew to a more intimidating stature as the filmmaker drilled deeper into GG's behavior and attempted the unthinkable: to sympathize with a monster.

A scrappy 16mm, 51-minute-long feature, "Hated" is the ultimate document of GG and his fire-breathing sense of self. It's a tangled story of a young, soft-spoken boy named Jesus Christ Allin who was soon baptized in the loogie-drenched waters of <u>punk rock</u> and set out to destroy himself through the arena of live performance. Briefly tracing his youth, Phillips isn't offering an explanation of future habits, but merely provides a glance at GG and the birth of his ferocity, leading to his famous spoken-word years, acts of self-mutilation, and idolatry of John Wayne Gacy (who provides the film's opening quote).

Rumbling around the punk scene for years, "Hated" picks up GG as he embarks on another round of musicianship with band members Merle Allin (GG's brother) and nude, flighty drummer Dino Sex. The following tour, as well as much of the theatrics presented in "Hated," is prompted by Phillips himself, who pokes a stick at GG and <u>films</u> the results. Of course, GG doesn't need much in the provocation department, but it's interesting to watch "Hated" unfurl not only as visual proof of GG's antics, but also for

GG's infamous anti-social life soon permits him a booking on "Geraldo" to better butter his murky message of anarchy; it takes him to the campus of NYU where he promptly peels a banana and shoves up his rear end; we also see fragments of the tour, leading to several hilarious/revolting scenes of GG either beating his fans or defecating on the stage and smearing the results all over his face. You gotta love attention whores and their unshakable foundation of shock value.

### THE DVD

Visual:

With a full frame presentation, "Hated" retains the low-tech, student-film vibe it was created under. With film sources all over the map, the grainy, smudgy creation is most likely the best the picture has ever looked on any home video format to date. I found the DVD to be an encouraging blast of older film-based documentary techniques (how far we've come since 1992!), making it a treat to watch.

### Audio:

The Dolby Digital 5.1 sound mix is trying very hard to come up with

something significant for the ears, but considering the modest nature of the project, there's little dynamism to be found. However, the ferocious, bass-heavy song selections are given a lift by the mix.

## Extras (or, as the DVD is labeled, "Bonus Crap"):

First up are two feature-length audio commentary tracks, one from director Todd Phillips and one from Merle Allin and Dino Sex. Phillips is obviously the more engaging, knowledgeable, professional track to listen to. An amateur filmmaker at the time of production, Phillips discusses the numerous challenges he faced trying to assemble a documentary out of GG's life. He reveals the tricks of the documentary trade, shares some backstory on the NYU incident, and explains the John Wayne Gacy connection to the film in hilarious detail.

Merle and Dino provide a snide, tiresome track, cracking jokes and trying to expose Phillips's filmmaking fudging. I didn't find a moment of it entertaining, but the track will be of great interest to fans of GG and the band.

"Interview with Merle Allin and Dino Sex" (63 minutes) is an extensive conversation with the two remaining members of the Murder Junkies. For obvious reasons, Merle does most of the gabbing here, recalling his time with GG, along with the rise and fall of the band. Reactions to the movie are also offered. The best is saved for last, when Merle, with a straight face mind you,

"Interview with GG's Mom" (3 minutes) sits down with Mrs. Allin to discuss her boy and his wild ways, including the origin of the whole Jesus Christ name situation. Nothing revelatory here, but the footage provides absolute proof that GG wasn't born from the depths of hell. It was a more a paneled basement in the Midwest.

*"Live Videos"* (11 minutes) is a montage of GG's live performances. As if "Hated" didn't provide enough proof of GG's stage intensity, here's some more footage of the man in his element, making a mess of everything within his reach.

"Cover Contest Art Gallery" (5 minutes) sifts through the submissions of fan-made art created for the cover of this DVD release.

# FINAL THOUGHTS

Of course there are many, such as Merle or fanboy "Unk," who proclaim Allin to be a misunderstood genius; that his theatrical style of performance and rage was a comment on social ills. I'm not 100% sure about that thinking, but I will admit that GG's legend still holds incredible power and his stage-based acts of aggression and bodily functions took him places few dared to go. GG Allin was a self-made spokesman for a subculture, and "Hated" is the ultimate presentation of his dementia.
