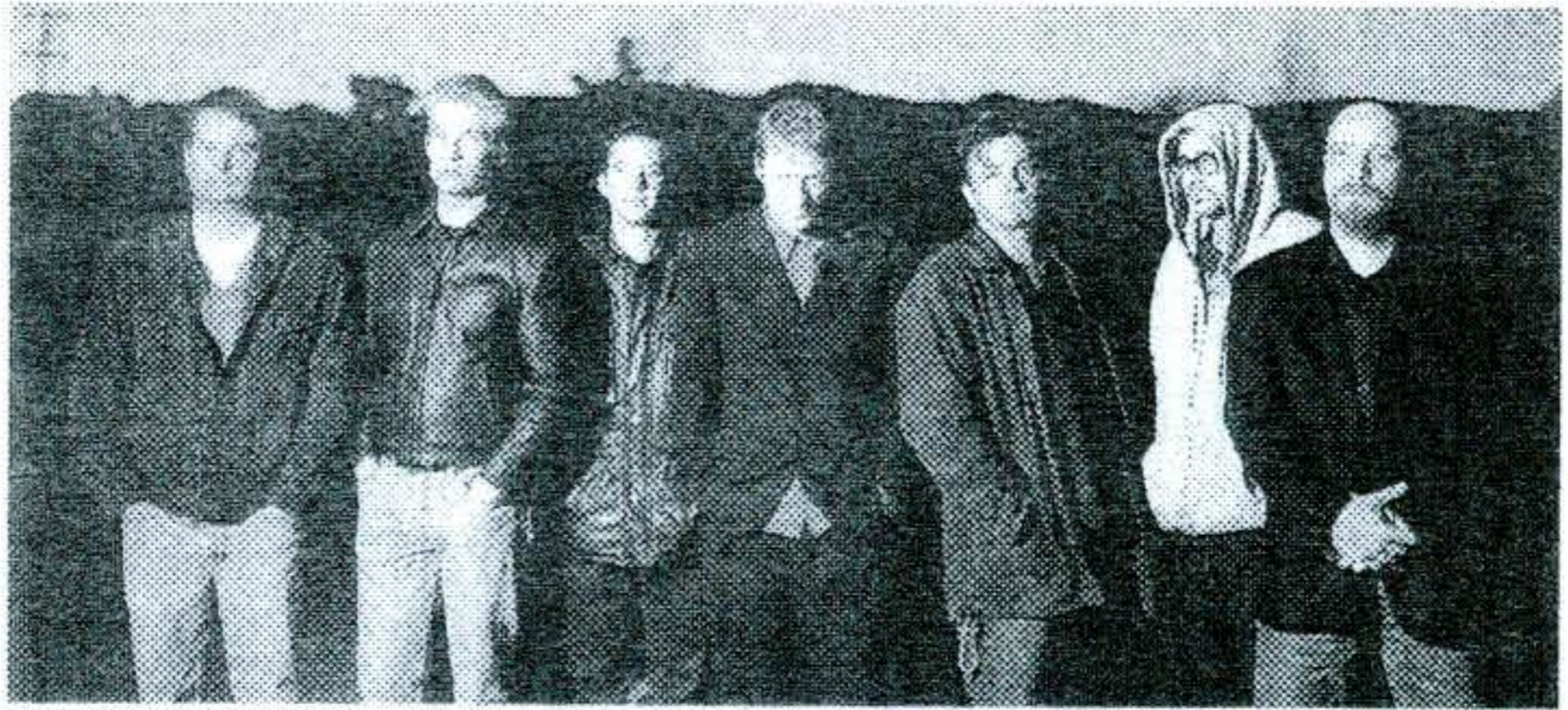

Cracker & Camper Van Beethoven: The First Annual Camp Out Live

When he split up alt-rock underdogs Camper Van Beethoven to form the exponentially less interesting Cracker, it was hard to imagine rooting for David Lowery ever again. But since the reunited Camper has

done its legacy proud with 2004's *New Roman Times* and solid live performances, if Lowery still wants to trot out the band that gave us "Teen Angst (What The World Needs Now)" and "Eurotrash Girl," so be it. And it appears that everyone in the Camper camp is cool with the arrangement—every year they head down to Pioneertown (about 120 miles east of Los Angeles) in September to whoop it up and air out their discographies. All the solo and side projects are also given the stage, as evidenced on the new two-hour-plus documentary of the inaugural Camp Out. Prior to Monday's screening, Camper members Victor Krummenacher, Greg Lisher, and Jonathan Segel will perform live, and after, they'll sign copies of the disc.
