Obituary is one of the greatest American death metal bands. On Frozen Alive, their first ever DVD we are treated to an incredible performance. Obituary captured live in Poland in April of 2006. On this performance they mix it up playing both classic and new material and the flow of the set list is phenomenal. Obituary do not skip a beat as they chug through 20 plus tracks in their 70 minute set. It's amazing how these guys hold up during the set, by the end looking just as fresh as they did at the beginning. The most impressive performance is by drummer Donald Tardy who plays his heart out all night and looking much like Artimus Pyle's evil little brother. Guitarists Trevor Peres and Allen West are precise and deliver a near perfect performance while John Tardy growls like a banshee choking on it's last meal. The audience thrives off the band's pulverizing energy.
