

Tim Buckley -- My Fleeting House

Although his son <u>Jeff</u> is now an alternative icon, papa Tim remains a cult concern. Maybe it's because of his dilettantish approach to music-making. In the space of two years, from 1969 to 1970, he made four albums ranging from folk-rock to (yikes!) jazz fusion. Or maybe it's just that his heroin jones got in the way of any subsequent meaningful communion with his muse. This DVD collects 13 TV performances, including a deathless version of "Song to the Siren" from <u>The Monkees</u>. Buckley associates remember the man in additional interviews.
