'69's so-so Songs From a Room has Bird on a Wire. And '71's superb Songs of Love and Hate has Famous Blue Raincoat and Joan of Arc. Prepare to be bummed out.

"We're still lost," croons Margo Timmins. Hardly. This 10th studio set finds the somnambulant roots foursome right on course - and accenting guitarist Michael Timmins' woozy, languid laments with lush strings, a children's choir, psychedelic flourishes and even a searing blast of raw-boned blues-rock. Paths may be mostly familiar, but the trip is well worth taking. **Download:** Cutting Board Blues; My Little Basquiat.



Michael Buble Call Me Irresponsible

Irresponsible? Not a chance. Granted, the world's bestpaid lounge crooner does change his tune slightly on this fourth CD by adding a few more Latin grooves, contemporary touches and original cuts to the list of swinging jazz classics and smoky pop standards. Mavis Staples

We'll Never Turn Back *Rhythm & Blues*

Any new disc from smokyvoiced gospel legend
Staples is a treat. But this stirring batch of classic civil rights anthems — soulfully reinterpreted and performed with the help of blues guitar master Ry Cooder, a swampy band and Ladysmith Black Mambazo — is the kind of minor miracle that's enough to make you believe in a promised land. And Mavis?
She'll take you there.

One part Yeah Yeah Yeahs. One part Bow Wow Wow. One part White Stripes. One part P.J. Harvey. A dash of Billie Holiday. Put it together and you get London's Noisettes, a post-punk power trio. Now get their crackling debut.

Golden Smog

Blood on the Slacks *Pop/Rock*

On this eight-track EP, this Midwestern semisupergroup play it typically fast and loose, tossing off an easygoing, rambunctious set of backporch alt-country, Beatlesque pop-rock and quirky instrumentals.

Joel Plaskett Emergency

Ashtray Rock Rock

The concept: Two pals start a band, only to split up over a girl. The reality: Plaskett's ambitious fifth CD is his most fully realized work, utilizing everything from power-chord arena-rock and melodic '60s pop to falsetto electro-funk and '50s doo-wop.
