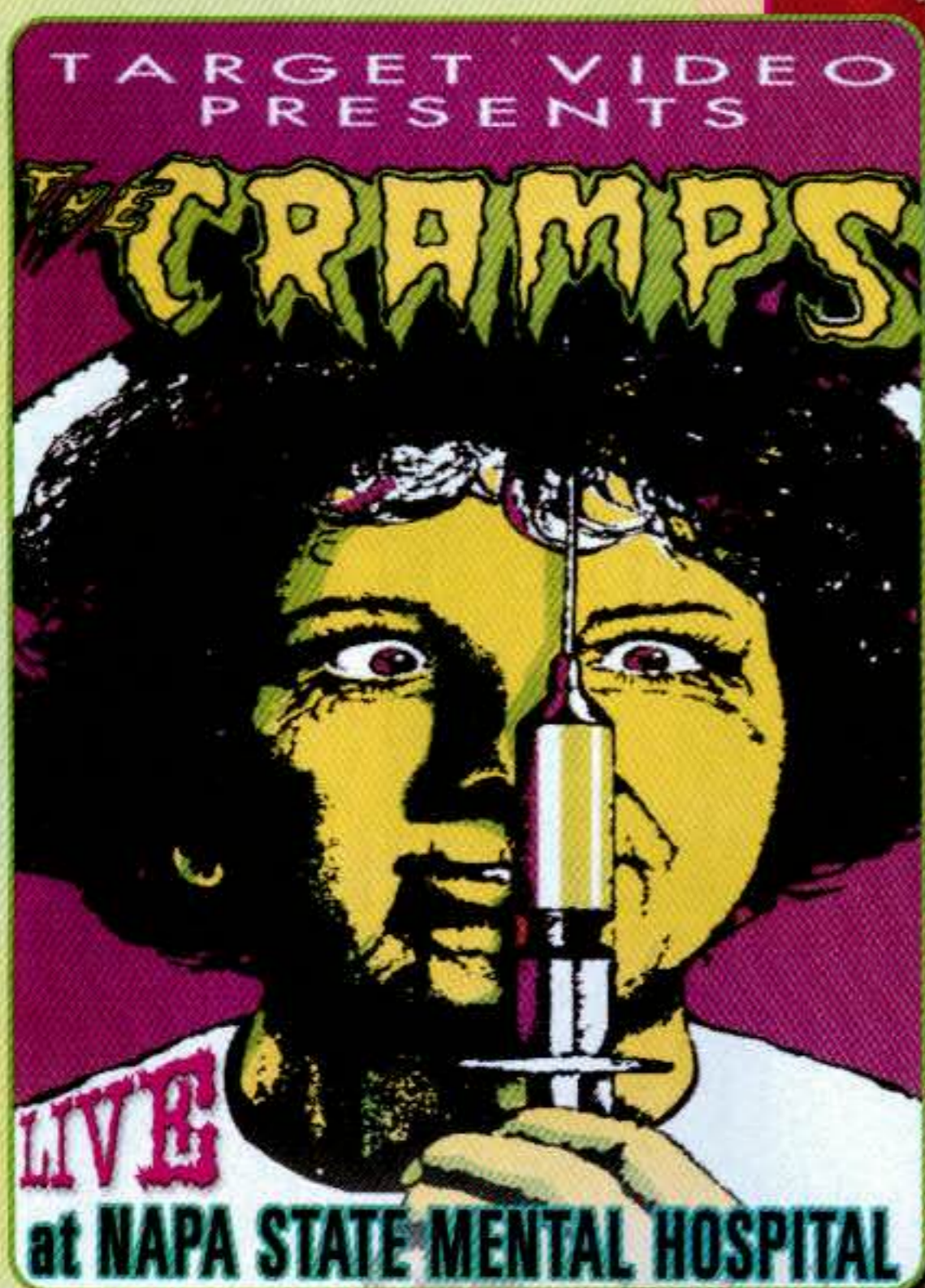

The punk/rockabilly band The Cramps at times seem like they belong in a mental institution, but in 1978 they visited one to give a performance for the inmates. No explanation is given for what brought them there in the first place, or why the hospital staff ever allowed it, but the resultant video is punk rock history. The black and white footage is often out of focus or out of sync with the audio, but that just adds character to the video. At times the inmates go a bit wild. One even steals the mic and howls for bit during Human Fly, but the band's not phased. For fans of the genre, this required viewing. Extras include a documentary of sorts of Target Video, an alternative San Francisco cable show from 1978-79. There are also trailers for several other MVD punk titles.
