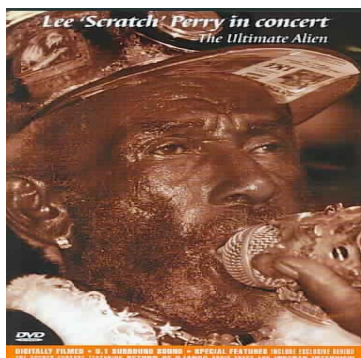

**Comments:** To really understand Lee "Scratch" Perry -- wait, scratch that. No one understands Lee "Scratch" Perry. To really get a sense for what Perry is like, you need to see him. His brilliantly quirky production work of the 1970s tells you what a genius he is, but to get a glimpse of the madness that drives his genius you need to see him onstage in all his diminutive glory, wearing a a royal robe and a cap covered with random found objects, dancing around with a faraway look in his eyes, rapping nonsensically about ingratitude and insanity and being a space alien. Notice also the brilliant tightness of his (apparently all-British) backing band on this live performance. Perhaps not essential for every library, but definitely recommended to all reggae collections. (RA)
