rock keyboard pantheon as a result of both his incredible work with Yes and his legendary solo albums, such as *The Six Wives of Henry VIII*. He takes the viewer on an entertaining journey in his latest DVD, *Rick Wakeman's Grumpy Old Picture Show*.

This is by no means your usual live concert video. The format is Rick live in concert, doing a "this is your life" kind of one-man show, complete with schtick, stand-up, anecdotes, pictures and interviews. With an arsenal of keyboards at his disposal, he cleverly utilizes onstage video to play along with video clips of his fellow bandmates, his daughter and

even himself on certain multi-layered keyboard tunes. This helps to flesh out some of the arrangements, and it generally works well. His anecdotes include stories about a vasectomy (his own) and playing a memorial service for the royal family in natty golfing attire.

The humor and stand-up is cute, but the DVD soars most when Rick really gets down to playing. I especially enjoyed his Prokofiev-like (his description) adaptation of "Eleanor Rigby," "Merlin the Magician" and excerpts from Henry VIII and "Starship Trooper," though the vocalist on "Starship" has a tough time filling the mighty shoes of Jon Anderson.

Rick Wakeman has had a huge impact on progressive rock keyboardists since the early 1970s. Grumpy Old Picture Show proves that his chops are still ferocious and his sense of humor intact, and I recommend it for progressive rock keyboard fans.
