


Brothers of a Feather

Back in 1996, during a rare touring break for the Black Crowes, the two longhaired masterminds behind the soulful Southern rock band decided to head off on a brief, 12-show acoustic tour highlighted by a three-night sold out stop at the famed ROXY in L.A. On this collection from those three shows, the brothers hirsute give new meaning to the term "intimate" as they croon their way through 20 painfully poignant, yet aurally arousing tunes perfect for a chill evening with friends, or a little southern romance with your other. Armed with nothing but guitars, mics and a harmonica, all other distractions were removed from the true heart and message behind what mag the Crowes so alluring. Classic renditions of such heart-tuggers as "My Heart's Killing me" and "Jealous Again," along with a bunch of brilliant covers including Little Feat's "Roll Um Easy" and highly underrated Brit John Martyn's "Over The Hill," leave a sweet, angelic hum ringing in your ears. Overall, there's over a hundred minutes of hair, blues and bellbottoms to lose yourself in. Audio purists can rejoice in knowing that there is a CD version available, however only 14 tracks made the cut.








## **Ghost Overture**
