‘The Night Evelyn Came Out of the Grave’ begins with some crazy guy running around mad. Then the opening credits roll and we come to a couple in a car. They stop at a supposedly abandoned castle slowly on its way to ruins. The camera shows us someone lurking out in the trees watching the couple enter the building.

The castle in ‘The Night Evelyn Came Out of the Grave’ has a fabulous dungeon room that would make any dominatrix jealous. And this dungeon gets plenty of use throughout this film. ‘Evelyn’ was filmed in 1971 in color and is 99 minutes in length.
