Marking what would have been his 70th birthday, Elvis Presley: The Last 24 Hours explores what is known and unknown about the death at age 41 of the King of Rock & Roll. Also of note from MVD is Dead Boys - Live At CBGB 1977. The band was originally from Cleveland, but located to NYC just when the punk scene started to heat up. Captured here in high-quality video is the group when it had just finished its Sire debut album, Young, Loud and Snotty. In a relentless, high-energy set, manic lead singer Stiv Bators shows why he was - Eagle Rock Entertainment one of punk's primary poster children. The DVD's extras are cool, too, including recent interviews with guitarist Cheetah Chrome, manager Hilly Kristal and an interesting clip of opening act Steel Tips, whose frontman begins the set by lighting firecrackers attached to his chest. Kalimba Entertainment president and six-time Grammy-winning Earth, Wind & Fire founder Maurice White has paired up with Tony-nominated actor, choreographer and member of the famed dance troupe Hines, Hines & Dad Maurice Hines — for the Broadway-stepping musical Hott Feett. The contemporary urban play will feature Hines' stylized choreography and direction set to White's Earth, Wind & Fire hits, including "Shining Star," "September," "Boogie Wonderland," "That's The Way of The World," and "After The Love Has Gone," as well as new originals that White is composing for Hott Feett. A live band will perform the songs during the theatrical production. MTV Books writer Heru Ptah is the author of the book of the four-act play, which is now casting for the workshop

phase. A Broadway opening is anticipated in early 2006.

Meat Loaf is in negotiations to play the sinister "Child Catcher" in the upcoming Broadway production of Chitty Chitty Bang Bang. Adapted for the stage by Jeremy Sams from lan Fleming's original text, the musical features a score by Richard M. Sherman and Robert B. Sherman, who provided songs for the original film version. Adrian Noble directs and Gillian Lynne choreographs. The musical will begin previews at Broadway's Ford Center for the Performing Arts on March 29 in preparation for an April 28 opening.

MTV has greenlit two new series: Meet the Barkers featuring Travis Barker of Blink-182 and his wife Shanna Moakler; and the Nick Lachey Project (working title) that captures America's favorite pop-star husband as he embarks on a breakout journey to find a record label and launch his solo career. The two new series join the third season of Newlyweds: Nick & Jessica and the second season of The Ashlee Simpson Show. As the only one of the series not directly associated with Jessica Simpson, the pressure is on Meet the Barkers. In this series, the tattooed, mohawked drummer of Blink-182 invites us to watch as he begins life with a former Miss USA turned TV actress - kinda like Newlyweds but more dysfunctional. Featured are interviews of musicians who were a part of this transitional moment in American music, including Chick Corea, Herbie Hancock, and Keith Jarrett, in addition to those who were profoundly affected by his innovations — Carlos Santana and Joni Mitchell, among others.
