"The Hudson Brothers Razzle Dazzle Show: The Complete Series" (VSC)—1970s-era Saturday morning TV show "The Hudson Brothers Razzle Dazzle Show," starring brothers Mark, Bill and Brett, has now made it to DVD. The inspiration for numerous mid-1970s gay-boy crushes in their shag haircuts, tight pants (now we have a better idea why Goldie Hawn married brother Bill, father of Kate and Oliver) and platform shoes, the brothers sang and clowned their way through each episode. Slapstick shtick, corny jokes, cover and original tunes (including their modest hit "So You Are A Star"), terrible special effects and canned laughter made up a majority of the show.
