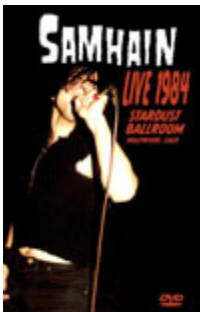




As Friends Rust/Strike Anywhere Camden Underground, London
