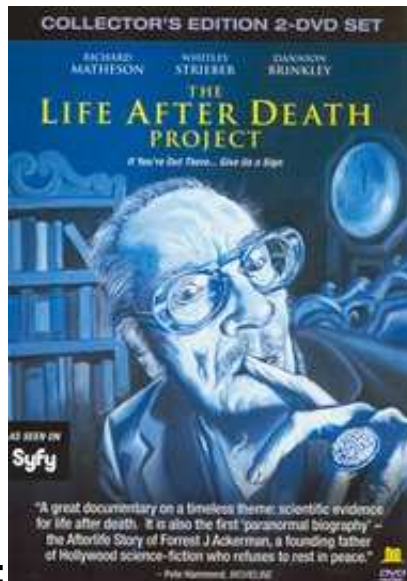

- The documentary is primarily about Forrest J. Ackerman, the “Poor Man’s Vincent Price,” and his supposed haunting and pranking of friends and other people he knew.
- The fact it was mostly about Forrest J. Ackerman was one of the only things about it that interested me.
- This documentary consisted mostly of people trying to make weird connections from odd things that happened, and how it had to be Forrest haunting them.
- We weren’t shown much in the way of pictures, audio or video evidence, it was mostly people just

recounting stories.

- Got to see some neat insights into the life of Forrest J. Ackerman.
- Some people had interesting things to say about the Sci-Fi luminary.
- The stories told about Ackerman were pretty fun to hear, including the recurring theme of his love of pranks, puzzles and word plays.
- A lot of what was shown was a little goofy, like trying to do tests on a watermark on paper “left by a ghost.”
- It is really nice that Paul Davids put this together, about his good friend, who he probably misses. I think he is just looking to hard for a meaning, and connection to his deceased friend, that just isn’t there.
- The documentary itself was well shot, and the editing was pretty good.
- It is better than most documentaries and other shows about ghosts and hauntings out there.
- The special feature about the Demise of the Ackermansion was especially interesting.
