Rolling with Mick, Professor Louie, Jimi Hendrix and Locksley

This week's variety-packed column features a former Rolling Stone, a longtime associate of The Band, a new recording from Jimi Hendrix and a new power-pop band called Locksley.

'The Tokyo Concert,' Mick Taylor Band (Inakustik/MVDvisual, HHH 1/2)

Guitarist Mick Taylor was hired in 1969 to replace founding Rolling Stones guitarist Brian Jones after building a reputation in John Mayall's Bluesbreakers. He played on the albums and songs of the group's second massive period of worldwide success (1969-1974): "Honky Tonk Women," "Brown Sugar," "Tumblin' Dice" and more. However, he eventually left the band because of songwriting credit disputes and because he never associated fame with artistic merit.

This Feb. 23 DVD shows a capsule view of what he's been up to in the years since then, including material from his own albums and tunes associated with others. He's backed by former Jeff Beck pianist Max Middleton, drummer Jeff Allen, bassist Kuma Harada and guitarist Danny Newman. Excellent song choices make for an interesting show mostly unhampered by vocal shortcomings. The Rolling Stones' "No Expectations" and Dylan's "Blind Willie McTell" are highlight songs.

'Whispering Pines,' Professor Louie & The Crowmatix (Woodstock Records/MVDAudio, HHH 1/2)

This March 9 CD is this prolific band's latest release, a combination of studio and live recordings with a beautiful cover created by The Ulster College NY Design Department in cooperation with Woodstock Records. Professor Louie was part of later recordings by The Band, and he has been touring regularly with these "keepers of the flame" in the years since Robbie Robertson decided to go off the road.

The opener/title song proves Professor Louie wants to carry on The Band's spirit, and has the instrumental chops to do so. He's missing Levon Helm and Rick Danko's vocal talents, but The

Other highlights include a soulful live version of Dylan's "Serve Somebody" and "I Wouldn't Do It That Way," which adds The Mighty Gospel Giants to the vocal mix.
