METAL HELL: Can you tell us a little about IN THE MIDST OF BEAUTY?

MICHAEL SCHENKER: It's a, Schenker/Barden album. It reminds me of the good old days with Gary, and of course having Simon, Don & Neil on it makes it very special.

MH: Do you feel this album picks up where Built To Destroy, left off?

MS: I would say that this album picks up where we left off with the first MSG album (in) 1980. I heard one of his (Gary's) songs and I loved the sound, vibrato and his feel. That's when I picked him in 1980.

MH: How many solos on this album were improvised?

MS: I decided to improvise all solos. It gives it a fresh, rocking live touch, full of emotional recordings of the moment and a long life because of its many different countless expressions that happen when improvising. When I look at the big picture I do things differently every so often to keep my work interesting and less repetitive over the years. I can always come back to other interesting ways. There are many. What feels right at the moment I will choose to do.

MH: What guitars did you use on this album?
MS: I played my Dean V's. There were other
guitars in the studio and I tried them but can't
remember if any of them made it on to the record.

MH: How have you managed to keep true to yourself through changing musical climates?

MS: I believe in what I do. There is no need to change because of trends, that's not what I am here for.

MH: Was it intentional to find seasoned musicians for the new line-up?

MS: I am led. Things happen in cycles. It's a reminder and one more chance to experience and to enjoy.

MH: Do you still practice guitar much?
MS: I practice as I write, rehearse and play live.

MH: One Night At Budokan & Strangers In The Night, are classic live albums. What do you think made these albums so essential?

MS: Live albums are good for people who are capable to play interesting things in the moment. Of course sound is (also) important. Ron Nevison captured that on Strangers In The Night and we copied his technique for the Budokan album.



MH: What are you listening to lately?

MS: I don't focus on music when it plays around me. I personally don't put music on myself unless it is connected to my work. I don't want to wear it out and (would) rather treat music like Schokolade to enjoy it in its fullest when I create.

MH: "Rock Bottom" is one of your classic solos. What do you recall about creating it?
MS: The "Rock Bottom" solo is different every time I play it but it has guidelines that I kept over the years. It's good for jamming, to improvise and have fun. It is fresh over and over again.

MH: Your playing always has a sense of melody. What inspired this aspect?

MS: I used to explain it like making children's songs and combined with dirty rock makes it magic. I think it's just a reflection of who you are. Even when you jump start in the beginning when learning to play, you copy what you like because it's something similar to' who you are.

MH: Do the members of your band(s) influence your playing?

MS: I don't think so. It is a chemical reaction. You mix blue with red or blue with green, the outcome is different.

MH: Will we see a tour for this album?
MS: Yes. We are working on a World tour right now.

MH: It was rumored that Ozzy once wanted you to join his band, what do you recall about this?

MS: He called me in the middle of the night while I was sleeping. It was like a strange dream. He was very distressed and I did not know what to say. The next day I passed it on to the other MSG members and because I was in the middle of rehearsing for recording Assault Attack with Graham Bonnet and Cozy Powell I had to refuse. Later I was glad that I did because I would have lost my freedom, which I created MSG for.

MH: What are your fondest memories of playing with Ratt?

MS: Warren De Martini was a friend and a fan of mine in those days. He asked me to play with them. I had spare time and did. Oh boy, what a mess they were. I thought UFO was bad. I mean 24 hours a day of arguments, so tiring. Good players though and lots of girls.

MH: Does there exist much, or any, unreleased material?

MS: There is material but I am too creative to dig in to old stuff. It's something for pension time.

MH: Any closing comments?

MS: Keep on Rocking and see us on tour.

Born in Sarstedt, Germany, Schenker started playing in his teens, following in his brother Rudolf's footsteps, & appeared on the Scorpions fist album (Lonesome Crow) at the age of 16.

Michael joined UFO after the band saw him at a Scorpions soundcheck & played with UFO until 1978 & re-joined the Scorpions in late 1978 & would play on 3 songs for their Lovedrive album in 1979, after 3 months touring with the Scorps, Michael left & formed the Michael Schenker Group, (along the way being offered a gig with iAerosmith).

Gary Barden sang on the first 3 albums & was then replaced by (ex-Rainbow) singer Graham Bonnet for the Assault Attack album & tour. Barden was re-hired mid-tour & appeared on the Built To Destroy album in 1983.

MSG returned in 1986 under the altered moniker of the McAuley Schenker Group & released 3 studio albums with a more commercial hard rock direction.

Schenker re-joined UFO for their 1995 reunion LP Walk On Water, the 1st reunion attempt was short lived & he soon resurrected MSG with new members & cranked out 3 albums before re-joining UFO for 2 more albums (Covenant & Sharks), after falling on hard times, the guitarist returned with MSG once again in 2003 with the Arachnophobiac CD, which he did a 2 year tour in support of. In 2005, Michael celebrated the 25th anniversary of MSG with the Tales Of Rock 'N' Roll album, which had singers from every line-up of MSG.

Then entered the studio in 2007 with original singer Gary Barden, Don Airey (keys), Simon Phillips (drums) & Neil Murray (bass) for the In The Midst Of Beauty album, (released last April).

The 2008 touring line-up consists of Chris Glen (bass), Wayne Findley (guitar/keys) & Chris Slade (drums).
