

"Trek Stars Go West"

Before they became interstellar stars on the original "Star Trek" series, William Shatner, Leonard Nimoy, DeForest Kelley and James Doohan paid their dues on a range of early TV Westerns. Sometimes they looked pretty silly in American Indian garb. This two-disc collection assembles episodes, mostly around 1960, of "Bonanza," "The Lone Ranger," "The Last of the Mohicans" and the rare "Outlaws," a series seen from the perspective of the outlaws themselves. Also included is Shatner's laughably bad 1968 spaghetti Western "White Comanche." He plays a dual role as battling half-brothers, one good, one evil. Guest stars on this set include a young Robert Redford, Joseph Cotten, Lon Chaney Jr. and Cloris Leachman. Six hours. From Video Services Corp.
