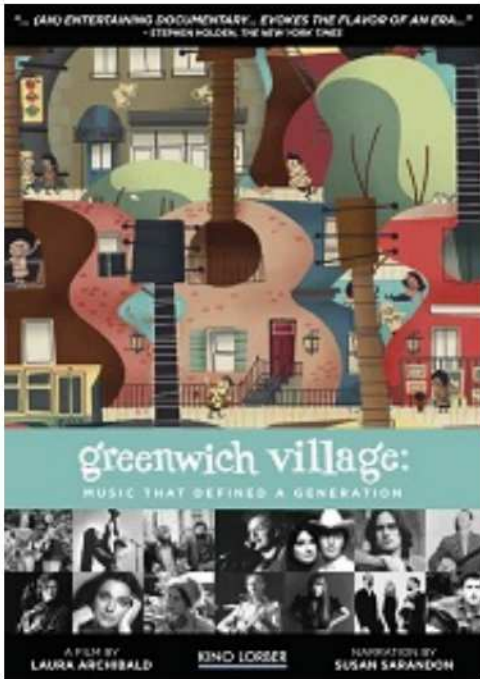




# Greenwich Village: Music That Defined a Generation

### Main Plot Points:

- Greenwich Village was the birthplace of the singer/songwriter and songs of love and relationships. Between 1961-1973, many musicians in The Village banded together to sing about the radical social upheaval of the time. Narrated by Academy Award Winner Susan Sarandon (Thelma & Louise, Broken City, Dead Man Walking), Greenwich Village: Music That Defined A Generation is a feature-length documentary about the Greenwich Village music scene and how it sparked everlasting political, social and cultural changes.
- For the first time, the greatest singer-songwriters, authors and performers from Greenwich Village reflect on how they

collectively became the voice of a generation. Through poignant interviews, rare archival footage and new live performances, Greenwich Village: Music That Defined A Generation tells a story about community, courage and most importantly - music.

but it's also pretty biased.

- My biggest problem with any type of “scene” whether it’s music, art, or film is that if you are part of that “scene” you think everything in it is so important. If you aren’t part of it, well it doesn’t mean a thing to you.
- That’s where this documentary loses me. These people honestly believe they helped change the world and that they made a difference and Greenwich Village was such a huge important thing. Well I never lived there and I wasn’t even born when any of this happened so it’s hard for me to really think of it as that important.
- But the music is pretty good. I’m not a huge fan of folk music overall, but Bob Dylan has some great tracks, The Mamas & The Papas had some good songs and Don McLean’s American Pie is iconic. I never liked Joni Mitchell though.
- For fans of folk music, **Greenwich Village: Music That Defined a Generation** is probably much more interesting than I found it. These people definitely like to talk about themselves and how much what they did meant to the world, but did it really?

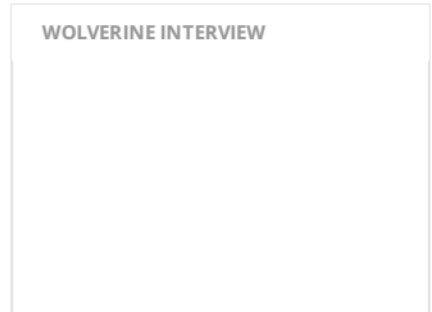

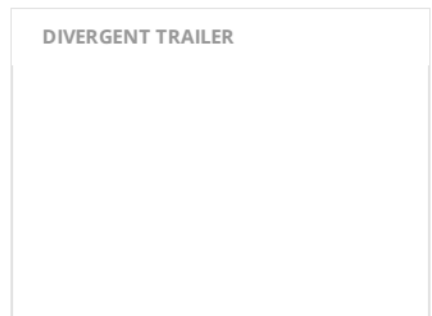
