they have a lot of time on their hands," explains Diane. "If we can help them use that time constructively, that's a good thing."

Robert says the survey revealed the inmates were interested in 21 topics, including poetry, westerns, self-help and languages, "so we are trying to get all of those genres." They collect items from libraries, bookstores and big-hearted people, and then swap out the reading material every few weeks to keep things fresh.

"The inmates have something to look forward to, they have something to do," says chief deputy Adam Infante of the Dallas County Sheriff's Office. "Idle hands cause problems, and they're busy with that, which makes everybody a little less tense."
