“Kids, don't chew on the windowsills.”

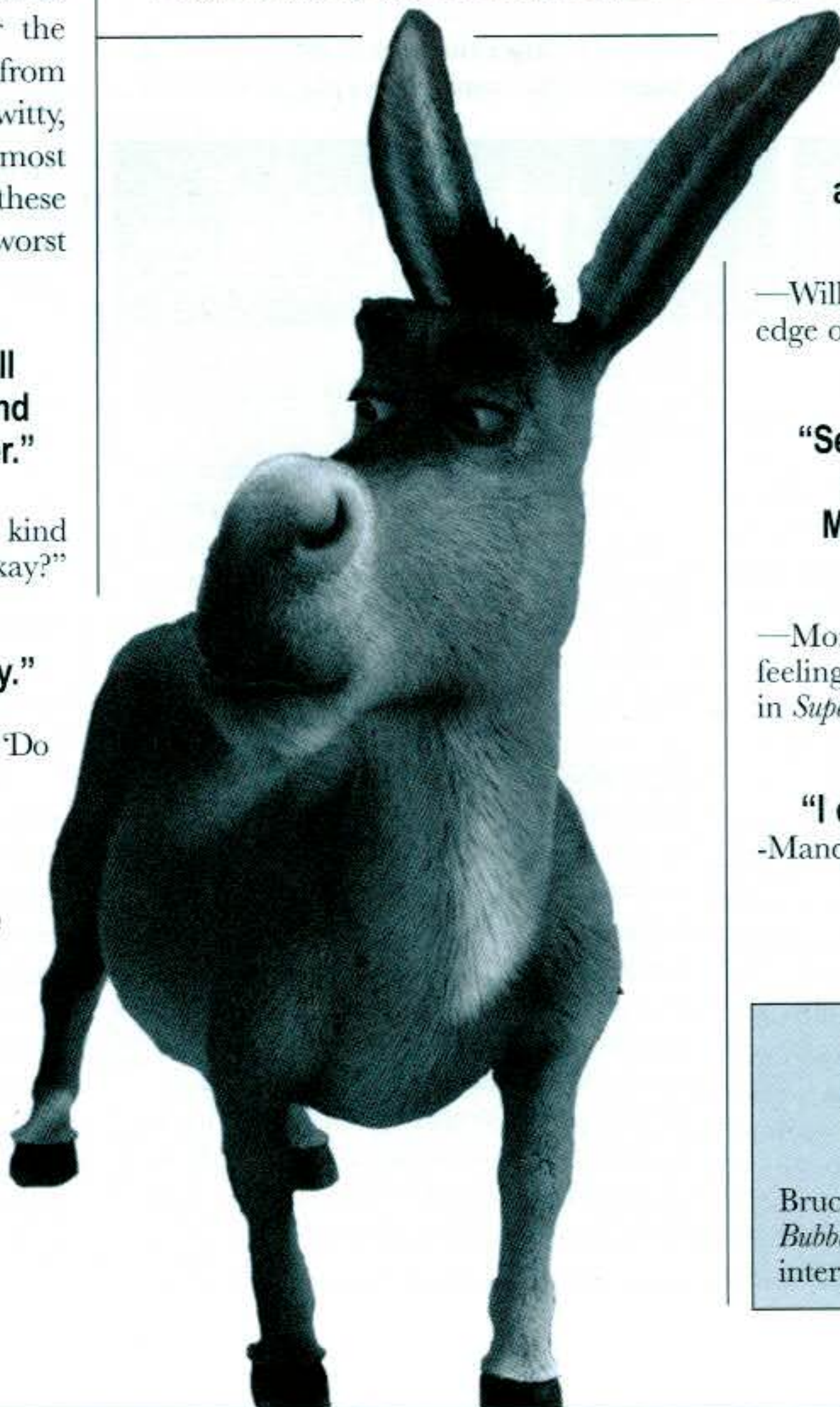
—Joan Cusack proves there is humor in *Raising Helen*.
