

JUSSI REIJONEN – sayr: salt / thirst (CD) Unmusic

Finnish-born guitarist, Arabic oud player and composer Jussi Reijonen offers sayr: salt | thirst. Recorded in one fully improvised take at Reijonen's home studio on steel-string acoustic guitar in March 2025. Split into two contrasting arcs, "salt" and "thirst." The performance weaves textural references of various string instruments from around the world with the musical form unfolding a personal narrative that vacillates between lament, unease, brightening and transformation. Reijonen's series is centered around a metaphorical reframing of the concept of 'sayr" as found in Arabic music - literally, "course" or "motion" - referring here to a musical pathway unfolding through improvisation in an acoustemological memory palace: a pathway of memory recalled and reimagined through music, refracting in reverse in the space between sound and personal experience. Reijonen navigates freely between them through improvisation, letting memories surface through the sounds themselves. Each gesture becomes a portal, triggering emotional and sensory echoes. They include coziness, pres-sure, downhearted and more. The four tracks on salt...shine via sola, sarvi, sai and keinu. thirst follows with seven more, including koto, kuori, kaarna, sae, kiedo, aina, and ennen. THE RUBINOOS – LIVE AT

THE RUBINOOS - LIVE AT ROCKPALAST 1978 (CD) Made In Germany Music

Made In Germany Music Alongside Greg Kihn, the Tyla Gang, Earth Quake, and Jonathan Richman, the Rubinoos were among the musi-cal figureheads of the successful US label Beserkley Records (1973-1986) from Berkeley, California. From 1975 onwards, the label's bands conquered the charts worldwide with their US power pop rock and received plenty of airplay — as did "I Think We're Alone Now" (1976) by The Rubinoos, a cover version of the 1967 hit by Tommy James & The Shondels. However, the band had already made their debut in 1975 on the album "Beserkley Chartbusters, Volume 1." The title of the LP was purely a marketing gimmick. When The Rubinoos appeared in front of the Rockpalast cameras at the Audimax in Hamburg on February 14, 1978, the four likeable musicians (Jon Rubin, Tommy Dunbar, Royse Ader, and Donn Spindt) were already the darlings of the American rock press. Forty-seven years later, singer and guitarist Jon Rubin takes stock: "This insight into the band's beginnings under extreme circumstances captures the spirit and silliess that have defined us from the beginning and continue to

define us today." PATRICIA BRENNAN OF THE NEAR AND FAR (CD) Puroclastic Records

Patricia Brennan's Of The Near And Far, is a further expansion of her striking compositional vision following the universal acclaim that greeted her 2024

release, Breaking Stretch, which earned Album of the Year as well as Vibraphonist of the Year in the DownBeat Critics Poll. Of The Near And Far marks another audacious evolution for Brennan, whose music combines bold innovation with singular ventures into her own wideranging inspirations. An avid amateur astronomer, Brennan travels with her own telescope whenever she can escape the light pollution of the city. For this album she superimposed the circle of fifths over a number of constellations that she viewed in the summertime sky of the Northern Hemisphere. Mapping these patterns together, generated collections of pitches that became the raw material for her compositions. "Andromeda" offers up an uneasy, turbulent feeling that reflects the story of Andromeda, the princess chained to a rock, sacrificed to a sea monster to appease the god Poseidon. "Antlia" carries the far more pragmatic name of an air pump, while "Lyra" was inspired by the doomed love story of Orpheus and Eurydice, while "Aquarius" has the fluid movement, conjured by the vibraphone/guitar melody, evoking the astrological symbol of the Water Bearer. The final two pieces broaden the scope of the project. "Citialli" is the word for star" in the Nahuati language of the indigenous Mexican people. Brennan composed "When You Stare Into the Abyss," based not on any individual constellation, but on the humbling experience of exploring the awe-inspiring infinity of the universe that surrounds us.

EARTH QUAKE - LIVE AT

EARTH QUAKE - LIVE AT ROCKPALAST 1978 (CD)

Made In Germany Music
Earth Quake was among the musical figureheads of the successful US label Beserkley Records (1973-1986) from Berkeley, California. Starting in 1975, the label's bands con quered the charts worldwide with their power pop rock — as did Earth Quake's cover of the Easybeats hit 'Friday on My Mind.' Earth Quake, formed in San Francisco in 1966, was heavily influenced by 1950s and 1960s rock and blues bands such as the Yardbirds, Muddy Waters, and the Kinks. They were signed to A&M Records in 1970 and produced their first two albums, Earth Quake (1971) and Why Don't You Try Me? (1972), with them and Allan Mason. From 1975 to 1980. Earth Ouake released four albums on Beserkley and worked with other artists on the label. Encouraged by the commercial success of Jonathan Richman's 'Egyptian Reggae' and the release of the label sampler Bezerk Times,' Beserkley artists Tyla Gang, Greg Kihn, Rubinoos, and Earth Quake embarked on a joint European tour in the spring of 1978. The bands' concerts on at the Audimax in Hamburg were recorded by WDR for the program Rockpalast. Forty-seven years later, guitarist Robbie Dunbar reminisces, 'A great performance, a great show, by our unforgettable band,' and encourages fans to Turn it up and enjoy!

of their maiden years and prior to their marriage, they offered up a lock of their hair, their girdle, and their maiden garments.

Another interesting aspect of the Artemis-Diana worship, was the construction of several temples, one after the other, on the same site in Ephesus. Syria, and dedicated alternately to Diana Artemis. The latest structure was built about 350 B.C., so large, that it became one of the seven wonders of the ancient world. It was the center of the Pan-Ionic festival of the Asiatic colonies, and assumed to itself almost every public function. It was serviced by special priests, priestesses, imagemakers, poets, and soothsavers. while at the same time offering asylum to fugitives, acquired vast wealth, became a treasury, and later even a bank. The roof of the temple was supported by 127 columns which were between 54 and 60 feet high. Thirty-six of the columns were beautifully sculptured on their lower sections, while the gable end of the temple showed the goddess flanked with her devotees bringing offerings.

The most celebrated ancient statue of this goddess is the "Diana of Versailles," which once stood in Emperor Hadrian's Villa at Tivoli, his favorite residence. During this emperor's reign, the villa contained miniature reproductions of many famous structures of antiquity. The next time you visit the Villa d'Este at Tivoli, look off in the distance (about half a mile) and you'll

see the ruins of one of the most splendid villas that the world has ever known. I'm sorry to say that time and the elements have taken their toll and most tours don't even visit the area now. How do you think you'll look when you're 1,900 years old?
