Metal Mind is at it once again; they have re-issued a number of albums in their latest re-issue campaign. I have selected a noteworthy record by a thrash metal band Retribution entitled *Made In Hell*. With a title like that, the album better fit the billing, and sure enough, it makes a valiant effort.
