Let start by pointing out that Delight is anything but ground breaking, so don't allow the title Breaking Ground fool you. At the same time don't confuse this band with the legions of gothic metal bands out there that feature female singers. There is one distinction here. Delight is much heavier at times with guitar riffs that rival current heavies as Disturbed and Godsmack as heard in "Divided." The are also good heavy pop moments as heard on the track "Sleep With The Light On" to me this is what Fleetwood Mac would sound like if they were a gothic metal band in 2007. I can't enough of that song it gets it's hooks in you and pulls you in. Paulina Maslanka might not have the most unique vocal out there right now but she maximizes her talent to the best of her abilities. Breaking Ground is a good effort by a relatively unknown band at least to the United States. Delight has enough variety to appeal to metal heads, Goths, contemporary rock fans and even fans of pop music. This is an album that won't rank in your top 10 of 2008 but you will likely pull out from time to time for a spin or two.
