They were kinda Earthly and with different types of percussion. I’m not the biggest Joss Stone fan, but she can belt out the songs and once the horns kick in for “It’s Not Unusual”, you know it’s Tom Jones time. The collaborations were good though with Jones and Stone doing a song and all the artists covering The Beatles’ “Let It Be”. If you like British music, this will work for you.
