In 1996, director Bruce McDonald gave the world 'Hard Core Logo', a documentarystyle parody film that follows the fictitious band Hard Core Logo through the highs and lows of an ill-conceived reunion tour across their native Canada. In 2010 McDonald unleashed a sequel that – spoiler alert! – cannot be discussed in any capacity without giving away certain secrets that cause the original film to pack so much punch. In this review, I will not give away any more 'spoiler' type information than that. VSC and MVD Visual have just released the two films together on Blu-Ray, packed into a spectacular metal tin and filled with a nice array of bonus features (commentaries, videos, featurettes, and more), as well as a stand-alone DVD version of 'Hard Core Logo 2'. The original film – based on a book of the same name by Michael Turner - is every bit as essential as 'This Is Spinal Tap', though it is hardly a comedy and needs to be seen by all fans of rock 'n' roll for vastly different reasons. The film stars Hugh Dillon as vocalist/guitarist Joe Dick, Callum Keith Rennie as guitarist Billy Tallent, John Pyper-Ferguson as bassist John Oxenberger, Bernie Coulson as drummer Pipefitter, and Julian Richings as the Iggy Pop-ish elder punk Bucky Haight, and features special appearances by the likes of real-life punk legends such as D.O.A. and Joey Ramone. Again, I'm not here to give anything about this film away. Just watch it. Seriously. The sequel stars the real-life Canadian band Die Mannequin (vocalist/guitarist Care Failure, bassist Anthony Bleed, drummer Dazzer Scott, and guitarist Stacy Stray), alongside Julian Richings (reprising his role as Bucky Haight), Sera-Lys McArthur, Shannon

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

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


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
