If there's one thing that I've grown more than tired of in movies it's writers and directors who end up resulting to nothing more than juvenile humor in order to get a laugh. While this can work in some cases there are far too many movies that have resorted to bodily functions as being their one shot at making people laugh and it's something that has grown very, very tiresome. So, imagine if you take that idea and do nothing more than fart jokes for an entire movie . . . I'm guessing you can see where this would make for a very, very bad movie.

*F.A.R.T: The Movie* bills itself as "the movie they said could never be made." Actually, I think there was a slight misunderstanding here. I don't think that "they" said it could never, it was more like that it SHOULD never be made. Fart lacks any true plot aside from Russell, who has a very acute case of flatulence, getting in an argument with his significant other Heather on New Year's Eve. She wants to go out, he'd rather stay home, and his constant farting has driven all of their friends away. While she goes out alone and broods over this problem, Russell watches television and finds that everything that is one is aimed around farts.

This is nothing more than 90-minutes of sketch comedy, and extremely bad comedy at that. This is a movie that goes beyond being low budget; I'm assuming that it was more or less a no budget movie. *F.A.R.T: The Movie* has a look to it that's far worse than any soap opera and it looks more like a very poorly shot home movie. The acting is absolutely terrible and continues to grow worse with each passing scene. The script meanwhile is filled with horrible one-liners, forgettable gags and constant post-production sound effects which are, you guessed it, all farts.

*F.A.R.T: The Movie* tries to poke fun at game shows, At the Movies, the Gong Show, and far too many other television shows. None of it is humorous, not in the least, and if you think that it gets bad when it starts, it just gets worse. If you take a joke that's not funny and then repeat it for an hour and a half, it doesn't magically transform into something that's hilarious. This is like listening to a group of first graders who find humor talking about flatulence incessantly, and that's exactly what *F.A.R.T: The Movie* accomplishes; nothing but bad comedy from start to finish. It's been quite a while since I watched a movie that I hoped and prayed would end quicker than what it did.

The disc doesn't include any extra features aside from a collection of trailers for other low budget films that don't look very good either, though they do look much better than what this film is. Actually Scarred looks as though it could have potential.

*F.A.R.T: The Movie* isn't the type of film I'd even dare someone to see. You might even have an idea that it might not be bad to see drunk but I don't think that's even possible. This film should be avoided if at all possible because Fart stinks, and not in the way that was intended.
