America's Music Legacy Series

MVD, 4 episodes, 120 minutes each, \$16.95 each

First four episodes of a 1985 documentary series make their DVD debut: Gospel, Country & Western, Rhythm & Blues and Rock 'n Roll. No extras listed.

Accidentally On Purpose: The DVD Edition

CBS Video, 2 discs, \$41.99

Comedy series with Jenna Elfman as a San Francisco movie critic that has a fling with a much younger man (Jon Foster) and is now pregnant. They decide to live together and raise the child, but the hijinks are just beginning. Extras: four featurettes, bloopers.

Apocalypse Now: Three Disc Full Disclosure Edition

Lionsgate, 451 minutes, 3 films, 3 discs, \$59.99 (BD debut)

Director Francis Ford Coppola's epic Vietnam film makes its BD debut and includes what the 2006 "Complete Dossier" did not: the documentary "Hearts of Darkness: A Filmmaker's Apocalypse." It does include both the original 1979 and the 2001 "Redux" versions. New extras include a 48-page booklet, photo gallery, archives from the set and keepsake case.

The Bionic Woman: Season One

Universal, 4 discs, \$39.99

This is the 1970s Lindsay Wagner version, not the attempted reboot. Includes five crossover episodes from "The Six Million Dollar Man." Extras: commentary, gag reel, featurette.

Bo Burnham: Words, Words, Words

Comedy Central/Paramount, 63 minutes, \$14.99

Stand-up special featuring Burnham, who became famous from his internet videos of him playing songs with ingenious wordplay and bad puns. Extras: two music videos, featurette.

The Crimson Wing: Mystery of the Flamingos

Disneynature, 78 minutes, G

DVD: \$29.99 BD/DVD: \$39.99

Predators

Fox, 107 minutes, R DVD: \$29.98

Austin director Robert Rodriguez attempted to reboot the "Predator" franchise with this entry, which features several elite killers suddenly falling on a planet that hosts the gruesome-looking hunters. It didn't do so well with critics, but at least there are no "Aliens" in this one. Stars Adrian Brody, Alice Braga, Danny Trejo and Laurence Fishburne. Extras: commentary, featurette, three motion comics. BD adds four more motion comics, making-of documentary, two more featurettes, deleted/extended scenes, BD-Live capacity.

The Real L Word: Season One

Showtime/Paramount, 533 minutes, \$36.98

First season of Showtime reality show starring six real lesbians who live in L.A. Extras: five featurettes, photo gallery.

Sesame Street: C is for Cookie Monster

Sesame Street/Warner Bros., 45 minutes, \$14.98

Collection of songs and stories featuring everyone's favorite blue cookie-crunching monster. Extras: extra song.
