Almost three decades into its career, the Osaka trio Shonen Knife has a brand-new lease on life in the U.S., thanks to the Goo Goo Dolls' enterprising bassist Robby Takac. His J-Rock-themed Good Charamel Records is unleashing three new releases from Naoko Yamano and crew — English-language versions of their last two Japanese albums "Fun Fun Fun" and "Free Time," plus a fulllength concert DVD, "Live at Mohawk Place." The band plays two Bay Area shows this weekend.
