Eldon (Boyd Kestner) volunteers to give her a ride in the parking lot with him and his son Cole (Tanner Richie). She tells them that her name is Beth. She asks where they're going and he tells her "wherever." Eldon talks a lot, but Cole is really very quiet, even when Jean tries talking to him. Jean really doesn't care as she is getting away from the trouble.

Besides, she's starting to like Eldon and Cole, at least somewhat. When she and Eldon get in an argument over lying and foul language, he pulls off the side of the road. She almost leaves then, but decides to stick it out for some reason. The next hint of trouble comes when there is a blowout.
