against you, like a parent missing from the family equation and a new stepdad doing his best to horn in on your territory, it only makes matters that much worse. Of course, the fact that Rusty Funkhouser's new stepdad is also a deposed vampire lord seeking to enslave humanity doesn't help things in the slightest. But hey, what are you gonna do? He's family now, right?

My Stepdad's A Freakin' Vampire is a really cool movie. It takes a smart aleck, slightly troubled student with family problems, and ramps things up by introducing the undead into the mix. Rusty (Lahcen Anajjar) hates his new stepdad, but his mother does her best to keep peace between the two and maintain a reasonable state of harmony. However, all that changes one day when the local mailman goes missing, and Rusty stumbles across the body stashed in the attic.

Convinced that his stepdad is a murdering fiend, he calls the cops and starts raising a ruckus. But everyone knows that Rusty has a grudge against his new parent-figure, and Richard (Larry Peterson) seems like a decent enough fellow, so no one believes the outlandish accusation. The fact that no corpse is present when the cops finally arrive also puts another nail in Rusty's story, and everyone thinks he's just flat-out lying.



But the next thing he knows, Rusty and his best friend are being attacked by the supposedly dead mailman -- whom now sports fangs, by the way -- and it all suddenly becomes clear that his stepdad is a freakin' vampire, and Richard has converted the mailman to the side of the undead.

There's a whole plot line involving Richard's attempt to raise an army of vampires by finding the long lost key to an infernal domain, and Rusty's battle -- along with his intrepid high school buddies and a vengeance-bound janitor -- to keep Richard from accomplishing his diabolical goals. But the real draw here is the laid-back, slacker humor and sense of fun that Director David Matheny brings to the table.

My Stepdad's A Freakin' Vampire is far more of a comedy-adventure title than a true gore-drenched horror flick. But don't let that fool you into thinking you won't get to see any blood or fangs, because you will. It's just that most of it is reserved for the tail end of the movie. But have no fear, because this film will still manage to keep your attention from start to finish with it's lovable, wise-cracking characters and penchant for scathing humor.

This movie is a definite recommendation. It's got great special

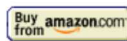
