



**'Live: Jailhouse Rock,' Divinyls (MVDvisual, 3½ stars)**

This May 22 DVD presents part of a triple bill (Divinyls, Rose Tattoo and Billy Thorpe & His Aztecs) recorded at Queensland's Boggo Road prison in 1983 by lead vocalist Christina Amphlett and the Divinyls, whose biggest U.S. hit is the then-controversial "I Touch Myself," which is included in a scorching set. Her voice seems to have trouble cutting through early on, but this is a good concert film. The band (co-writer/lead guitarist/harmony singer Mark McEntee, bassist Jerome Smith, drummer Charley Drayton, keyboardist Lee Borkman and rhythm guitarist Charlie Owen) is tight and powerful on highlights like "Love School," "Open Windows," "Make Out Alright" and an edgy cover of The Rascal's "Ain't Gonna Eat Out My Heart Anymore."

Fans who haven't seen Divinyls live will enjoy this program despite some drawbacks.
