

"The FP" (R): The debut film from the new video label Drafthouse Films has the makings of a cult favorite. It is set in a bizarre future where rival gangs compete in a deadly version of the "Dance Dance Revolution" video game for supremacy. Extras include featurettes, interviews, and a companion booklet.

"Big Miracle" (PG): Alaskan townsfolk come to the aid of a family of whales in this sweet-hearted comedy-drama, with a cast including John Krasinski, Drew Barrymore, Kristen Bell and Tim Blake Nelson.

"Reel Love" (Unrated): Leann Rimes stars in this predictable but cute comedy about a young woman who has grown accustomed to city life, but returns to her Southern home to care for her cantankerous father (Burt Reynolds) after he has a heart attack.



"Disco Exorcist" (Unrated): This over-the-top horror spoof follows the repercussions when a disco dancer dumps a sorceress and incurs her wrath.

"Kids Go to the Woods ... Kids Get Dead" (Unrated): It's hard to think of a more self-explanatory title than in this homage to slasher films.

"Project X" (R and Unrated): Todd Phillips ("The Hangover") produced this comedy about three high school kids who decide to throw the party of a lifetime ... one that quickly spirals wildly out of control. The DVD has the theatrical cut and one featurette; the Blu-ray includes an extended cut and two more featurettes.

Criterion Collection Titles: New releases from the prestigious video label include "The Gold Rush," Charlie Chaplin's wonderful silent comedy about a tramp seeking his fortune in the frontier, and "Shallow Grave," director Danny Boyle's debut film, a dark comedy about three friends who share a secret.

Also new this week: "Cat Run," an action comedy starring Paz Vega, about two bumbling private eyes trying to protect a beautiful but dangerous woman who is targeted by mobsters; "Thin Ice," a crime caper with Greg Kinnear, Alan Arkin and Billy Crudup; "Seeking Justice," a thriller starring Nicolas Cage and January Jones; "John Mellencamp: It's All About You," a profile of the popular musician; and "Tent City, USA," a documentary about the homeless problem in Nashville.

FX comedies: Two edgy cable comedies come to DVD and Blu-ray in advance of their new seasons debuting on TV June 28. "Louie" is a dark comedy with stand-up comic Louis C.K. playing himself. "Wilfred" is an offbeat series about a troubled young man who gets dubious advice from his neighbor's dog, who everyone else sees as a regular canine but who he sees as a surly Australian guy in a ratty dog suit.

Other new TV on DVD: "Web Therapy: The Complete First Season," a Showtime series based on a webisode comedy, with Lisa Kudrow ("Friends") as a therapist with an unusual technique of dealing with her patients; "The Sarah Silverman Program: The Complete Series," about an obnoxious, self-obsessed comedian stumbling through life; "Tyler Perry's House of Payne: Volume Nine," with 20 episodes of the sitcom; two volumes of the action kid's show "Power Rangers Samurai," "The Team Unites" and "A New Enemy"; and the kid-friendly comedy "Hey Dude: Season 3," about life on a dude ranch.
