CD of the Month: Mutiny - Funk Road



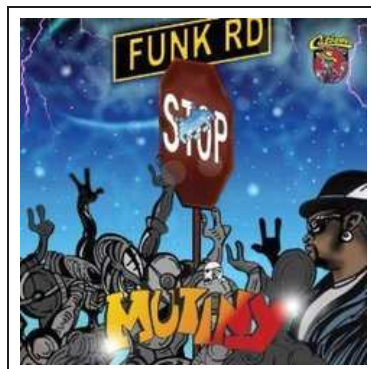

Jerome Eugene "Bigfoot" Brailey drummer and Rock & Roll Hall of Fame member is best known as one of the more prominent figures of P-funk! He co-wrote the P-Funk anthem *Tear The Roof Off The Sucker* from the now legendary *Mothership Connection* in 1976. His career started in 1968 playing behind the Unifics, then touring and recording with **the** Five Stairsteps. This was followed up with a stint with **the** Chambers Brothers and by 1975 he became a Member of Parliament – Funkadelic. By 1979 he created his own P-Funk offshoot group called Mutiny Featuring Jerome Brailey releasing the *Mutiny On The Mamaship* album that year. This was followed up with *Funk Plus The One*, then *A Night Out With The Boys*, and then *Aftershock* in 2005.

Funk Road is the new release containing 15 tracks. The project opens up with a funky spacey instrumental called *Thought Patterns*. Hip hop and Funk is mixed on *Something Better to Do*, and *What?.Yeah!!!!*. A funky up version of Wilson Pickett's *Ninety Nine and One Half* is also here. And even a Funk line dance called *Promanade (Git'er Done)*. There are soulful moments like *Sweet Blessings*, and *We Keep Doing Our Thang*. There are even rock moments with *Prayer for the Living* and *Diggy Don Dotta*. A recording or re-mix of the **Mutiny** classic *Lump* is present on the CD as well as instrumentals like *Rome Dog Roaming LI*.

This is a CD that has it all with funk and dance rhythms. You will like *Funk Road* by Mutiny.
