KEEP A GLASS EYE ON: Darris Love seems to be the only cast member with any experience, and it shows up in the movie. He handles and moves around the film with a lot more confidence than the other actors, pulling of the perfect, smooth gang-bangin' role and thus creating a character for Kris to look up to.

PROS: Adam Ripp sets up the whole project as a semi-documentary, and he really captures his objectives throughout the entire film. His direction of young, inexperienced actors really gives the film a raw edge that works well and reinforces the "real life" impression. In fact, the whole project is filled with this Ripp realism. If you didn't know this action was staged, it would leave you wondering. Lastly, the features offered on this DVD are also really outstanding.

CONS: The very things that make this film so strong are also the same things that may make it weaker for some viewers. Again, the acting is very crude (intentionally), and the film is somewhat choppy (on purpose). Some viewers will have trouble adapting to this style.

This is not only an action film, but also a musical.

KEEP A GLASS EYE ON: Maria Moulton does a

nice job as Mary, who acts as Jesus' partner until she is bitten. Moulton looks good and seems comfortable in the role – it's a nice first effort, so I'm looking forward to seeing more of her.

PROS: This film is not afraid to step on any religious toes. Jesus is a hard core action hero, and the film offers up some interesting musical scenes, like "The Messiah Hop," "Jesus Strut," and "Love Covers a Multitude of Sins." In addition, the film is very campy and cult-like. It was filmed in Montreal, has some great location shots, and is loaded with action and plenty of chase and fight scenes.

CONS: *Jesus Christ Vampire Hunter* has lots of poor delivery and over acting, a very cheese ball fight scenes, bad special effects, and terrible make up... which means it could be a cult favorite in years to come.
