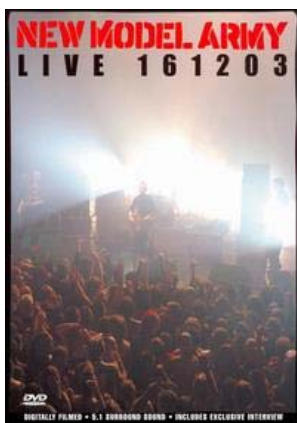

Live 161203 from the political rock & roll band New Model Army is less punk and more of a revolutionary charge. The playing is electric and the filming is flawless, director **Dave Meehan** bringing his formula back to the Astoria in London, this show taped on December 16, 2003. Not as dark as the **Echo & the Bunnymen** DVD, *Dancing Horses*, the lighting here corresponds with frontman **Justin Sullivan's** spitfire preaching, bringing the post-punk almost into the realm of rock & roll rap. The band is tight as a drum and the mostly male -- shirtless with many a skinhead -- audience packs the venue and is rocking, adding some energy to the group's performance. The 21 selections are dynamic, New Model Army blitzing far more than the aforementioned **Bunnymen**, though like that disc, the music will mostly be appreciated by NMA's audience and rock & rollers who enjoy a hot set of well-constructed music. Even when they let up somewhat, as on "Family Life," **Sullivan's** vocals are still, like **Ian McCulloch's**, not ready to take on the catalog of **Robert Goulet** -- or **Paul McCartney** for that matter. "It are what it are," and despite the monotone preaching of the frontman, what New Model Army do here is savage the music and the audience with a professional, determined, and very satisfying blast of power. For all the high energy, the band is quite musical and can throw a few punches from out of left field. There are lots of extras here: a 14-and-a-half-minute lo-fi soundcheck, a four-page biography (on the disc; there's no insert booklet) written by interviewer "Jet" **Martin Celmins**, and a 27-and-a-half-minute chat with **Justin Sullivan** -- it all adds up to a brilliant package that holds up under repeated viewings. Good job.
