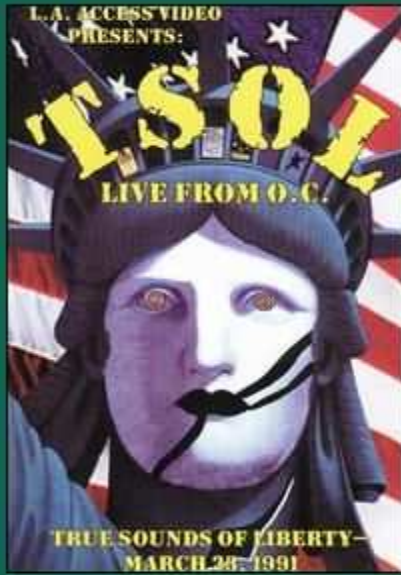

Case in point, the DVD release of "Live from O.C.". This raw concert footage, shot by Richard White in March of 1991 captures the true spirit of punk rock, as well as one of the last performances that the band had with late drummer, Todd Barnes. The original lineup is all here, Jack, Mike Ron, and Todd thrash out old classics like "The Sounds of Laughter", "Abolish Government", "Superficial Love" and many more. And what would the set be without the ultimate punk rock love song, "Code Blue"? After watching these guys play without much rehearsal and still kicking major ass, I couldn't help but think back to my younger days in the punk scene, and it was nice.
