**T**he Johnny Cash Christmas Special 1976 and The Johnny Cash Christmas Special 1977, both newly released on DVD, are the first to come out of the exclusive agreement between Shout! Factory and the Country Music Hall of Fame & Museum.

In the first special, Cash welcomes guests Tony Orlando, Roy Clark, Merle Travis, Barbara Mandrell and Billy Graham and includes the song, "Christmas As I Knew It."

The 1977 special has an all-star tribute to Elvis Presley, who had passed away two months prior. Taped at Nashville's Grand Ole Opry House, fellow Sun Records labelmates and rockabilly pioneers Carl Perkins, Jerry Lee Lewis and Roy Orbison join Cash on "This Train Is Bound For Glory" in memory of Presley.
