Marillion are akin to the likes of Iron Maiden for their attention to their fans. This is one such example of Marillion's largesse. The DVD includes a film of rehearsal for this tour where they let in fans to watch. The crowded room instantly reminds one of the Beatles TV appearance with all their fans sat round them as they performed songs. The DVD lasts over 220 minutes and includes the complete gig plus oodles of extras. It's a feature length movie of the concert on their last tour with tunes that got cut on the second disc.

This is a quality release for those who love this band, and there are lots, ranging from the obsessive to the keen.
